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Chapter 1 Product Introduction

1.1 Introduction

Body camera (hereinafter referred to as device) highly integrates with record, taping, capture, positioning, etc. It is embedded with positioning module with high sensitivity to locate the occurring position of events accurately. It can record the process and condition of events completely via record, taping, and capture.

It is widely applicable to public security protection, traffic police enforcement, fire safety inspection, city management, tobacco law enforcement, etc.

1.2 Packing List

When you receive the product, check whether there is obvious damage on the product package and its appearance first. Then open the package and check whether all the accessories are included. If something loses, contact us or our supplier.

1.3 Appearance




Table 1-2 Appearance Description

No.	Name	Description	
1	Tape	After the device starts up, press it to start taping. Then press it again to stop taping.	
2	Capture	After the device starts up, press it once to capture a picture.	
3	Photosensitive sensor	Sense ambient light to assist in turning on the IR lights.	
4	IR lights	 If you set IR as On, the IR lights will be enabled during recording or remote live view. If you set IR as Auto, the IR lights will be enabled automatically during recording or remote live view when the illumination is insufficient. 	
5	MIC	For sound collection.	
6	Type-C USB interface slot plug	Open the plug to connect to data cable.	
7	Record	 After the device starts up, press it to start recording. Then press it again to stop recording. When the device is shut down, hold it to start it up and start recording. 	

No.	Name	Description	
8	On/Off	 When the device is off, hold it to start it up. When the device is on, hold it to shut it down. After the device starts up, press it to inactivate/activate the screen display. 	
9	Loudspeaker	For sound play.	
10	M	 In live view mode, press it to enter the main menu. In configuration mode, press it to enter the upper menu. 	
11/12		 In menu, configuration, and input mode, press it to navigate between menus, items, and fields. In video playback mode, press △/▽ to speed up/slow down the playback speed. In live view mode, hold △/▽ to zoom in/out. In live view mode, press △/▽ to adjust volume. 	
13	<u>ا</u>	 In menu, configuration, and input mode, press it to enter the submenu, and confirm the selection or entered content. During recording, hold it to set a tag for the current video. Then hold it to cancel the tag. After recording, taping, or capture, select File to enter the file folder list, and hold the current file to set a tag. Then hold it to cancel the tag. 	
14	LED 1	 Solid green: The device is running. Flashing yellow (low frequency): The device is taping. 	
15	LED 2	 Solid red: The device is being charged. Solid green: The device is fully charged. Flashing red (low frequency): The device is recording. Flashing red (high frequency): The device is in low battery. 	

Chapter 2 Installation

2.1 Install Shoulder Clip

Install the shoulder clip if you want to wear the device on your shoulder.

Step 1 Parallel the sheet metal buckle of the shoulder clip with the shoulder clip slot on the front panel of the device, and insert the shoulder clip into the slot as the direction shown below.




Figure 2-1 Install Shoulder Clip

Step 2 Push the shoulder clip downward until it is installed firmly.

Step 3 Optional: Hold the shoulder clip, and squeeze the spring strip outward. Slide the shoulder clip upward to uninstall it.




Figure 2-2 Uninstall Shoulder Clip

2.2 Charge

When the device is in low battery, charge it in time.

Step 1 Open the USB interface plug on the side of the device.

Step 2 Connect one end of the USB data cable to the device, and the other end to the charger to charge the device.

2.3 Install Body Camera Assistant

Install Body Camera Assistant (hereinafter referred to as software) if you want to configure the device parameters, download files, etc. via the computer.

i Note

Install "BodyCameraAssistant-win32.exe" if your computer is in 32-bit operating system. Install "BodyCameraAssistant-win64.exe" if your computer is in 64-bit operating system.

Step 1 Get the installation file, and double click it.

Step 2 Select the software saving path, and click **Next**.

Note

The software is installed in C disk by default. You can click **Browse** to change the saving path.

Step 3 Click Next.

Step 4 Check Create a desktop icon according to your needs, and click Next.

Step 5 Click Install.

Step 6 Click **Next** to install the software drive.

Step 7 Click Finish.

Step 8 Click ${f Finish}$ to run the software.
